Internship Summary and Description

The student internship is being offered through the Sustainable Development Institute (SDI) of the College of Menominee Nation (CMN), and is funded through an Equity grant. Working with SDI, the student will develop a project that meets the criteria of the grant and the needs of the student. Additional Learning Objectives will be defined as the project is developed.

Internship Responsibilities and Learning Objectives

By the end of the internship you will be able to:

- Identify sustainability concepts.
- Understand the Menominee Theoretical Model of Sustainability.
- Apply sustainability concepts to your area of study.

Other responsibilities include:

- Work independently and with a team to perform the duties needed to complete the project.
- Participate in approved meetings, and SDI events.
- Getting along with others and having fun.

Program Requirements/Qualifications:

- Must be registered or currently enrolled in six (6) or more credits
- Must be a degree seeking student enrolled at the College of Menominee Nation or other accredited College or University. (Certain documentation may be required to confirm enrollment status.)
- Must have completed at least one (1) semester of study
- Student must be 18 years of age or older.
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- Internship must be related to students' academic degree program.

Timeframe and Stipend (if applicable):

The internship is scheduled to begin September 2020 and run through to the end of the semester.
