

CARES Act Emergency Aid Guidelines

The CARES Act provides short term financial need to students due to the COVID-19 Pandemic that if otherwise not addressed could prevent the student from persisting or graduation. This assistance was created to help students recover from the unforeseen expenses related to the disruption on campus operations due to the coronavirus.

ELIGIBILITY:

If you applied for Emergency Aid during the 2020 Spring or Summer, you are still eligible to apply for the Emergency Aid for this 20-21 academic year. Students may only receive one emergency grant during the 2020-21 Academic Year.

Eligible students need to be:

- Students must be enrolled, or accepted with the intent to enroll, during the term when the emergency aid request is made.
- Students need to be title IV eligible
- Include students that were active when campus shut down.
- Students will be prioritized by Financial Need (EFC, Remaining Need)

Assistance is granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, age, gender, disability or national origin.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students will need to fill out an application [online](#) or paper form and to submit to demadosh@menominee.edu

WHAT TO DO AFTER YOU'VE APPLIED

Once the student's application is submitted, it will be reviewed by CARES Act CMN Committee. The student will be notified by email of the decision. If approved for funding, in most cases payment will be made payable to students directly. Payment type will be determined by the College on a case-by-case basis.
